

Barriers to female entrepreneurship across the globe



Access to Finance: Banking



50% or more unbanked women in 14 countries



>10% male/female difference in 7 countries



50% approximate male/female difference in Turkey:



5 countries higher % women with bank accounts

Labor Force Parity:



Few women are working in or starting businesses in sectors such as manufacturing, high tech and transportation. The Gender-GEDI measures the extent to which women make up a balanced portion (40 – 60%) of the workers within a country's main employment sectors as this indicates the success potential for women to start businesses in a broader and more competitive range of sectors.



Out of 30 countries, **8 countries** received an overall balanced ratio (60/40)

while for 2 countries (India and Pakistan) formal employment is highly sex segregated, no employment sectors are balanced.
